 - STATA v.12 (CPHS license)

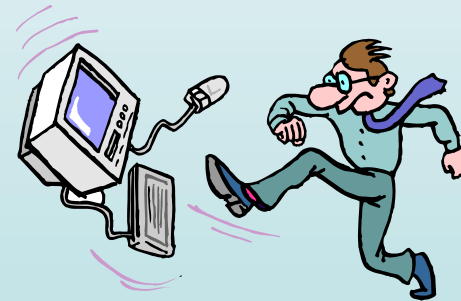
- The printing record;

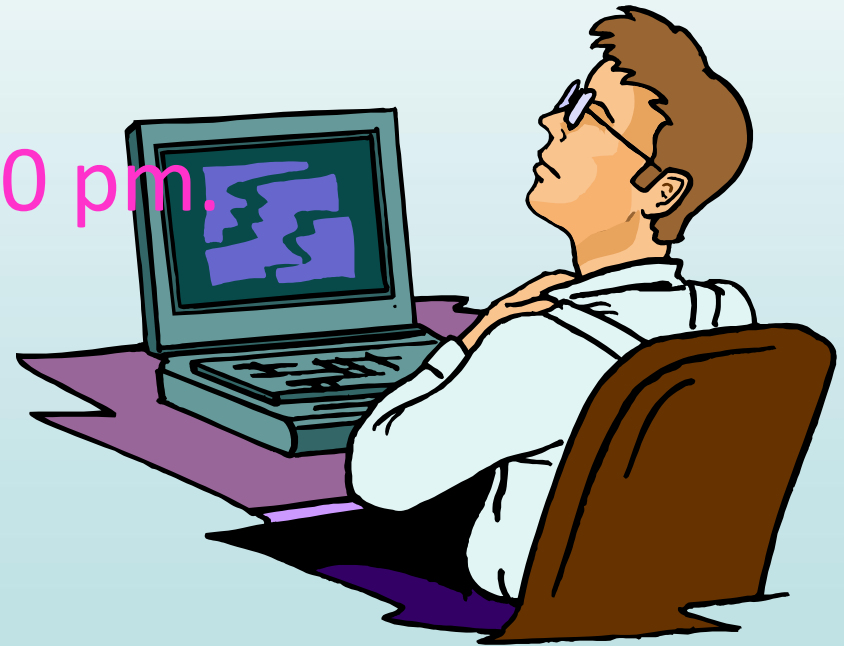

What we have in the College Library?

- 5 major resources:

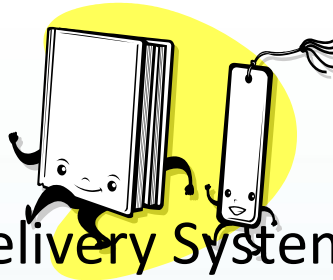
1. Book database; English + Thai books (over 7,000 items, search from Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC).

It is the An-Online Central Catalog of holding of member libraries in the Univ.

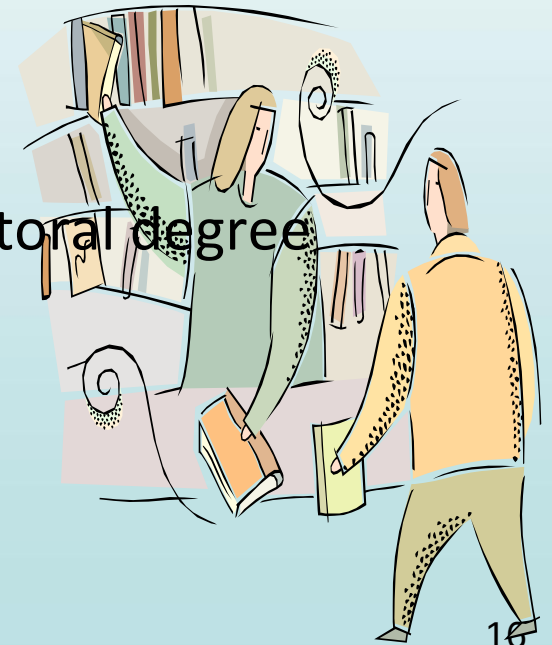
- User-initiated on-line borrowing & renewing themselves.



Circulation Rules



- General books + Book Delivery System
 - 10 items / 2 wks for Master degree students
 - 15 items / 2 wks for Doctoral degree students
 - Books renewal can be done 1 time (If there is a reservation, you will not be allowed to renew it)
 - Overdue fines : 3 baht / day
- Thesis/ Reference Books
 - 1 item / 3 days for both Master & Doctoral degree students
 - Overdue fines : 30 baht / day



- The library card will be invalid every semester, need to show the receipt of payment to the College librarian for activating.



2. Subscribed journals; 12 titles

- 10 English Journals
- 2 Thai Journals

3. College's Thesis database with some full text since 1996 -2009 FREE ACCESS) (1996- available in OPAC and CUIR-Univ. Network)

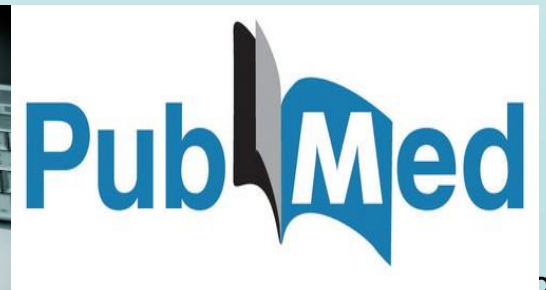
4. Journal of Health Research Database with full text since 1986-



5. **Online databases** (CU Reference databases cover a variety of online / full-text subscriptions and free trials databases provided on the campus network to **current students, faculty,** and **staff** of Chulalongkorn University. An authorized user can print, e-mail, download, or save the electronic content due to each site license agreement.

Subject coverage 5 main subjects are following;

1. General & Interdisciplinary Sciences
2. Arts & Humanities
3. Business & Economics
4. Science & Technology
5. Social Sciences



Search Tools for Online Databases

- Simple search
- Advanced search

Simple Search

The words or phrase that best describe the information you want to find i.e; title, author, keyword, phrases.

- **Title** :the title of the article, or book you are looking for
e.g. Health measurement
- **Author**: use the last name and follow by the first name
e.g. Streiner,David L.
- **Keyword**: a word/phrase that describes the topic
e.g.Quality of life, Malaria, Dengue ,Diabetes

Advanced search

Use Boolean operator;

AND: to find articles with both of two terms together e.g. *health education AND secondary school*

OR: to find articles with one or both terms
e.g. *health education OR health promotion*

AND NOT: to find articles which have the first term but not the second term
e.g. *health education AND NOT health promotion*

Search Tips for Online search

- Search more than 1 database
- Study “help menu”, “how to” from each database
- Use “quotation marks” to search for exact phrases
E.g. “health care reform” “health services access”
- Use the truncation symbol to find multiple forms of a word.
 - * is used as a right-handed truncation character only; it will find all forms of a word.
E.g. searching for econom* will find “economy”, “economics”, “economical”, etc.
 - ? is used to replace any single character, either inside the word or the right end of the word.
E.g. searching for “wom?n” will find “woman” and “women.”

(by using Turnitin software)

Example of Some Subscribed Databases related to Health Sciences

- ***ProQuest Dissertations & Theses Global***
 - the world's most comprehensive collection of dissertations and theses from around the world, spanning from 1743 to the present.
 - You have access to: Health & Medicine, Social Sciences, etc.

- **Academic Search Complete** is a large interdisciplinary database that abstracts and indexes over 9,300 scholarly and popular periodicals, and full text. More than 4,400 of the journals are peer-reviewed.
 - Health Sciences Databases
 - CLNAHL Plus with full-text articles is the world's most comprehensive source of full text for nursing & allied health journals
 - Dentistry & Oral Sciences Source
 - Earth/Environment Databases
 - Education Databases
 - Psychology/Sociology Databases etc.

- ***Wiley Online Library*** is an electronic collection of over 850 **full-text journals**

Subject coverage is multidisciplinary subject including;

- Health Sciences
- Life & Physical Sciences
- Medicine
- Social & Behavioral Sciences
- Veterinary Medicine
- Humanities
- Mathematics and Statistics etc.

- ***Science Direct*** is the world's largest subscription-based collection of scientific, technical, medical and social science **research journals**.
- ***Scopus*** contains 30 million **abstracts with full-text citations** in Life Sciences, Health Sciences, Physical Sciences and Social Sciences.
- ***Web of Science***

Open Source on the Net

- **PubMed** is a service of the U.S. National Library of Medicine that includes over 18 million citations from **MEDLINE** and other life science journals for biomedical articles back to 1948. PubMed includes links to full text articles and other related resources.
- **WHOLIS** is the WHO library database available on the web covering more than 70,000 bibliographic records i.e. books, journals, research reports, proceeding. There are some full-text link provided.

Criteria for Evaluating the Quality of Information on the Internet

- **Content:**
 - *Accuracy (Validity)* Is the information valid and supported by evidence?
 - *Authority* Who is responsible for the information?
 - *Currency* When was the site created? Was it updated recently?
 - *Disclaimer*
 - *Intended audience* Is this source too elementary, too technical, too advanced? Level of language
 - *Links*
 - *Purpose of the site* Is the purpose of the site clearly stated?
- **Design**
 - *Ease of use* Is the site designed to make it easy to navigate?

What you need to know for learning process?

- **OPAC;** to search for books, thesis (e-book included) in the Univ.
- **CU References DBs;** to search for e-articles, full texts of journals.
 - Search tools; simple search and advance search
- **Turnitin;** to check text that matches other papers or sources (QE Proposal, thesis, dissertation, etc.)
- **EndNote;** to manage your citation style for the thesis.
- **Publication (J Health Res);** to complete the Master degree (Univ. requires 1 paper published in the Journal. For PhD degree depends on the selected study program: course work (1 Int. Journal) or non- course work program (2 Int. Journals)
